# Yelverton Bowmen - Bray 1 League

This completely optional internal competition will take place between the beginning of October and the end of March. The reason the Bray 1 round has been selected is because it is quite a short round (30 arrows).

Shooting will take place on a Tuesday or Friday night.

Please make it known to the field captain upon your arrival that you wish to shoot the Bray 1 round, as target faces may require changing and so we know how many people want to shoot the round.

#### **Obtaining your Indoor Handicap**

You must have an indoor handicap before entering the competition.

As Archery GB have introduced new indoor Classifications no one yet has an indoor handicap. In order to obtain a handicap, you will need to shoot 3 indoor rounds of your choice, and record your scores on your Shooting Record Card. The records officer will use these scores to calculate your base handicap at the start of your entry into the competition.


You may then begin your Bray league scoring on your 4th round, which can be before your handicap is assessed.

### **Bray League Rules**

- 30 arrows on a 40cm target face at 20 yards with 10 zone scoring.
- Compounds will shoot 3 spot targets, all other bow types single face targets.
- 2 ends of sighters (6 arrows in total). 3 arrows per end.
- You must shoot the Bray 1 round at the beginning of the evening session; you are then free to carry on archery practice after completing the round.
- Only one Bray 1 round can be shot per evening session.
- Do not score your own arrows. Get your scorer to sign your scoresheet as the witness.
- The field captain for the evening will also be your Bray league judge for the evening. Their decision is final.
- You must complete at least 5 rounds by the end of the season (end of March).
- You can shoot and submit as many round scores as you want, but your Top 5 scores will make up the league results and go towards your end of season total.
- The winner will be the archer with the best handicapped adjusted total score over your 5 best rounds.
- The winner will receive a trophy to keep for 12 months with their name and score also being placed on the website results page.

40cm Bray target faces are also in the portfolio case.

Please remember to complete all boxes on the score sheet and get them signed.

Hand them in to the records officer with your Shooting Record Card at the end of every month.

#### Club Records and Indoor Classifications

All Bray round results will be used for club records and for obtaining indoor classification badges.

If you don't want to be part of the league but still want to obtain an indoor classification and handicap that is also fine:

- Archer Classification:
  - In order to obtain any of the three Archer Classifications you need to shoot 10 dozen arrows, in any combination of rounds e.g. 2x Bray + 1 x Portsmouth. Your scores should be recorded on your shooting record card and handed to the Records Officer for assessment.
- Bowman Classification:
  - In order to obtain any of the three Bowmen Classifications you need to shoot 15 dozen arrows, in any combination of rounds e.g. 2x Bray + 2 x Portsmouth. The rounds should be shot at an AGB (or AGB affiliated) organised meeting, or at a club target day. Your scores should be recorded on your shooting record card and handed to the Records Officer for assessment, and be supported by fully signed club score sheets.

As all evening sessions up to the end of March are available for shooting in the Yelverton Bowmen Bray 1 League they are classed as Club Target days in line with Archery GB Rule 313.

Therefore, archers are able to submit scores, shot on a Tuesday/Friday during the period of the competition, towards their Bowman Classification.

You may choose any of the current AGB Classification rounds. However, in order to obtain a Bowman Classification all scores bust be submitted on a completed, and signed club score sheet.
